Survey Results

This Maine 2026 Senate General Election Survey was conducted on behalf of 2Way June 11–14, 2026, among 1,008 likely voters in Maine. Respondents were recruited via text-to-web. Likely voters were identified based on past voting history and self-reported vote intention. The margin of error is ± 3.1 percentage points at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are larger for subgroups. Results may not sum to 100% due to rounding.

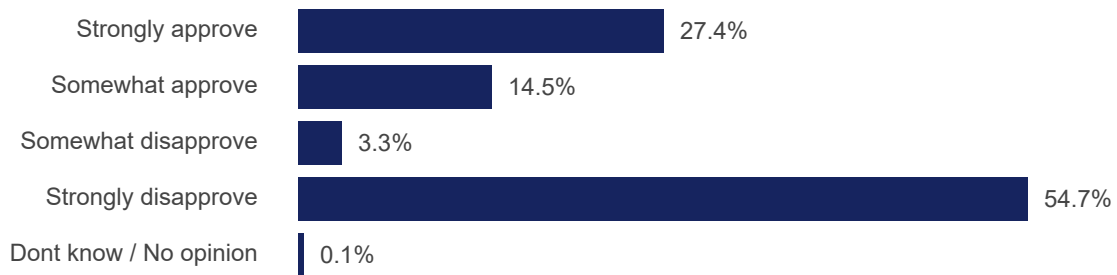

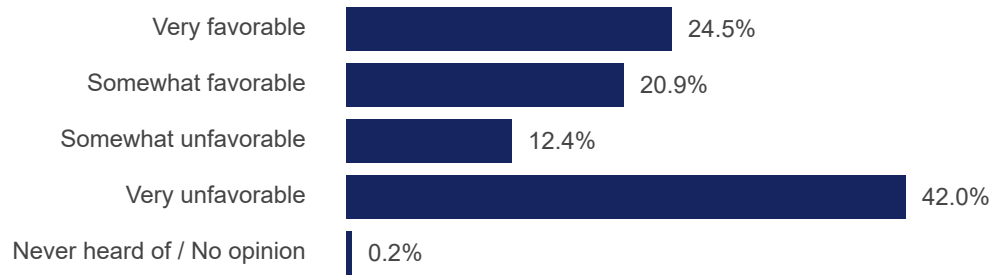

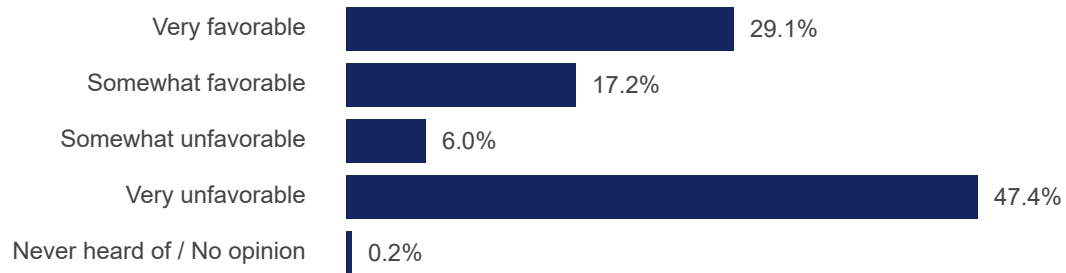

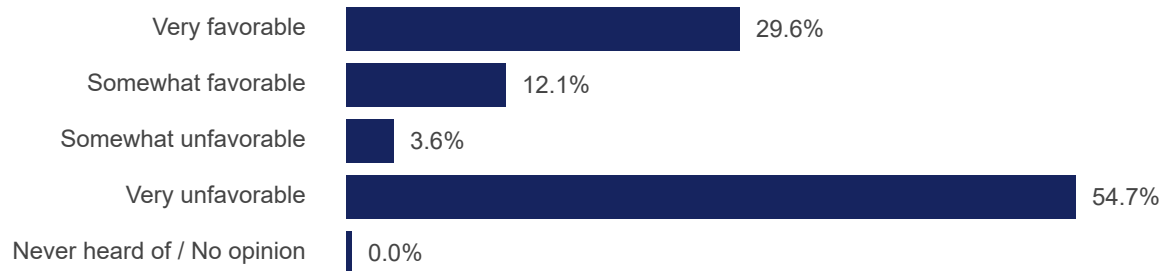

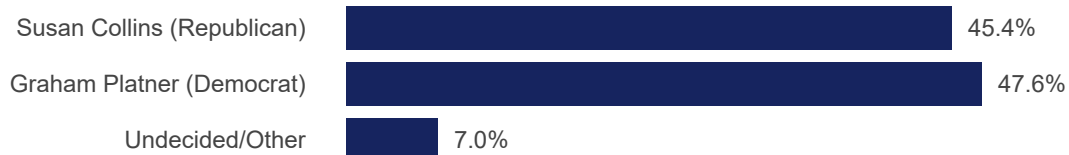

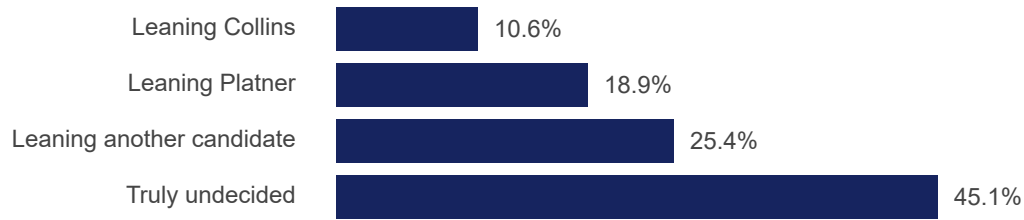

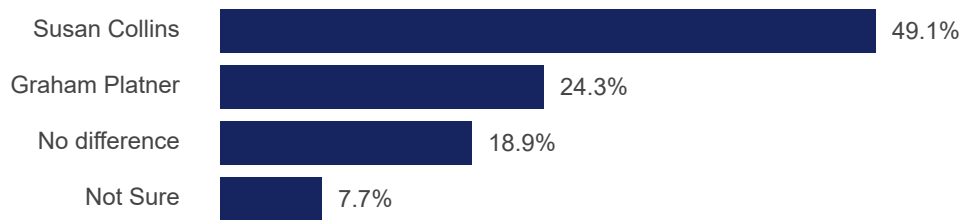

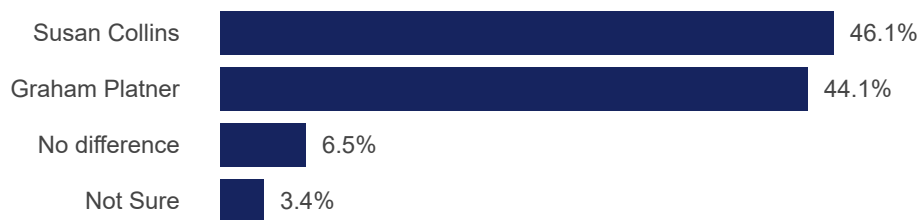

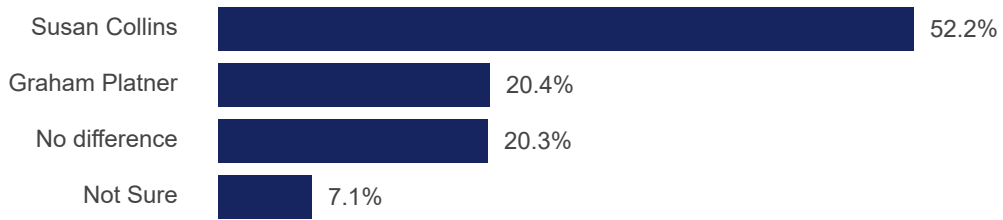

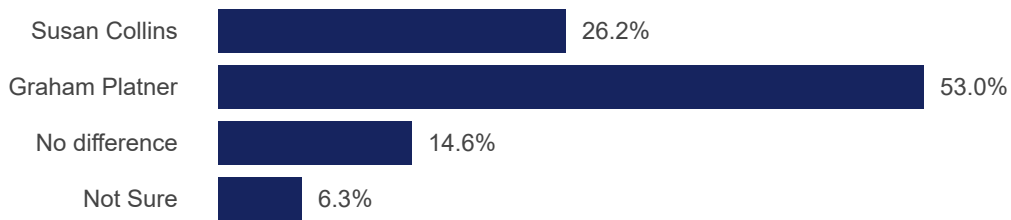

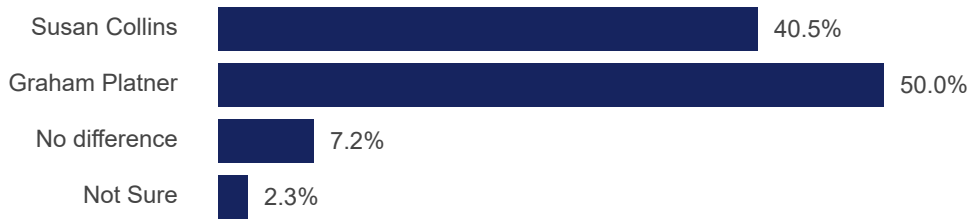

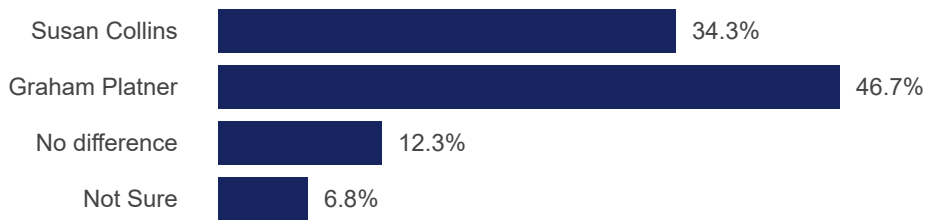

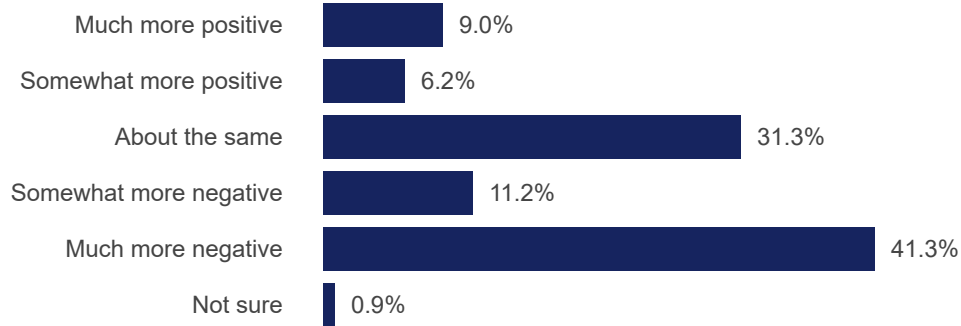

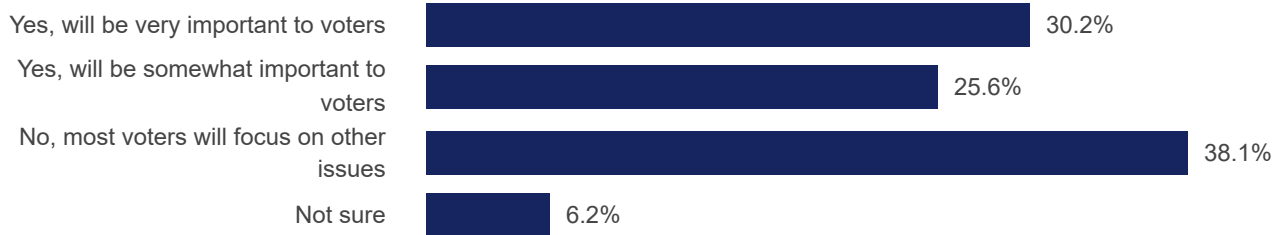

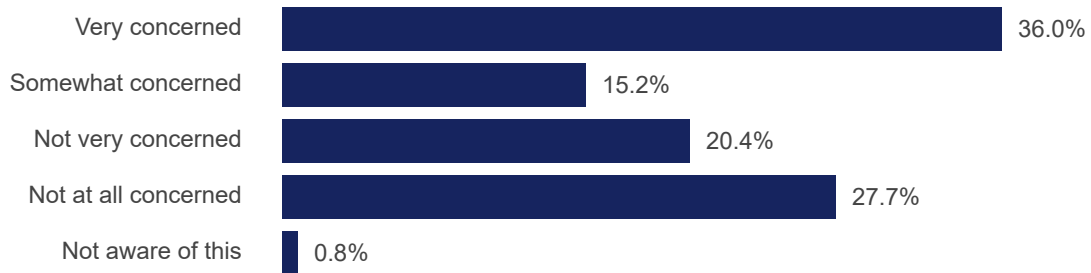

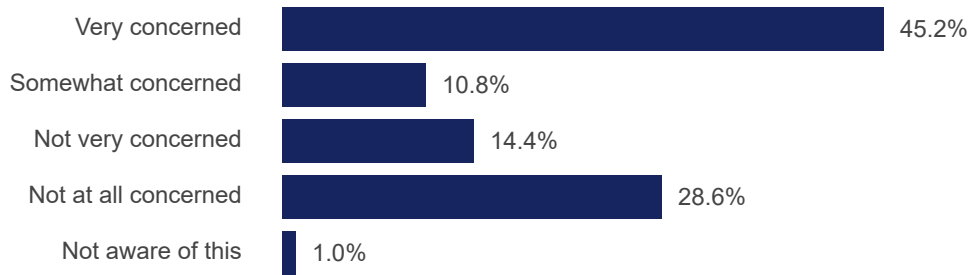

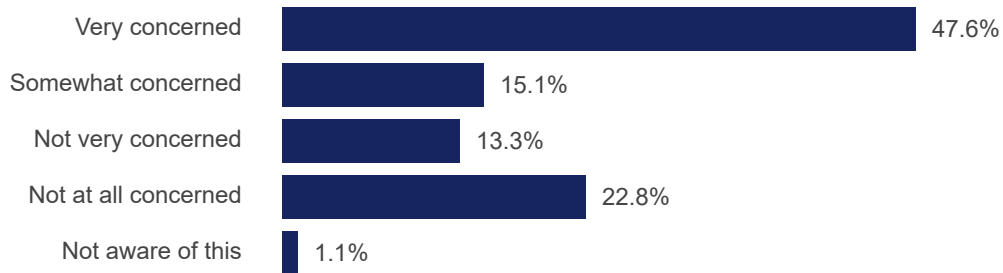

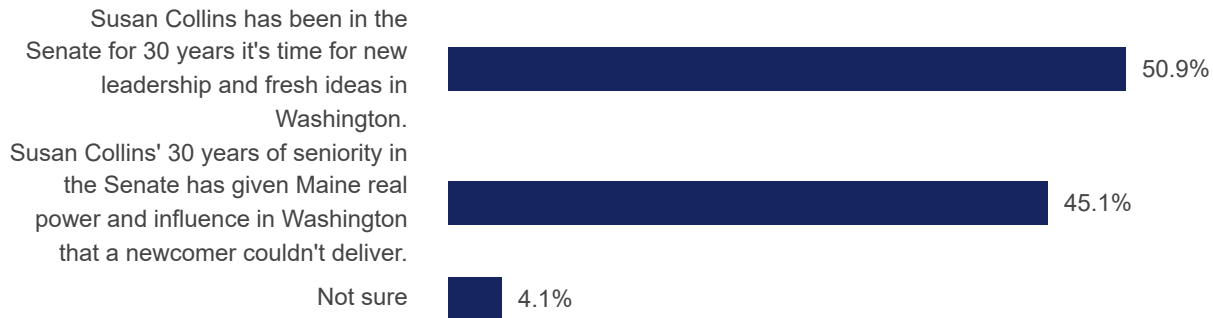

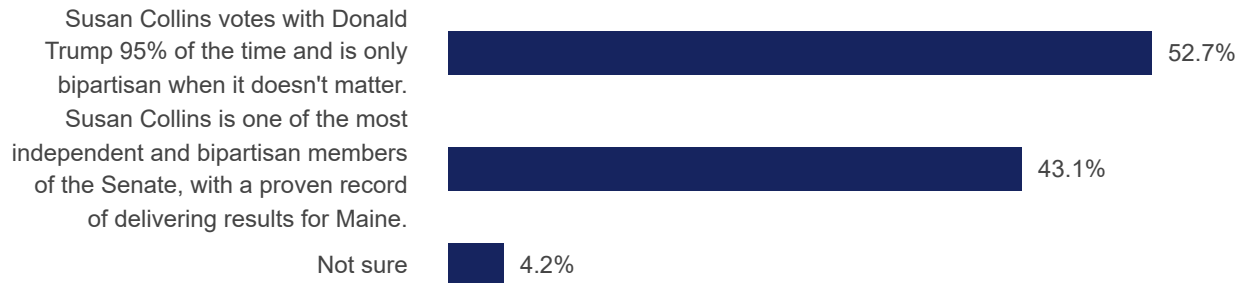

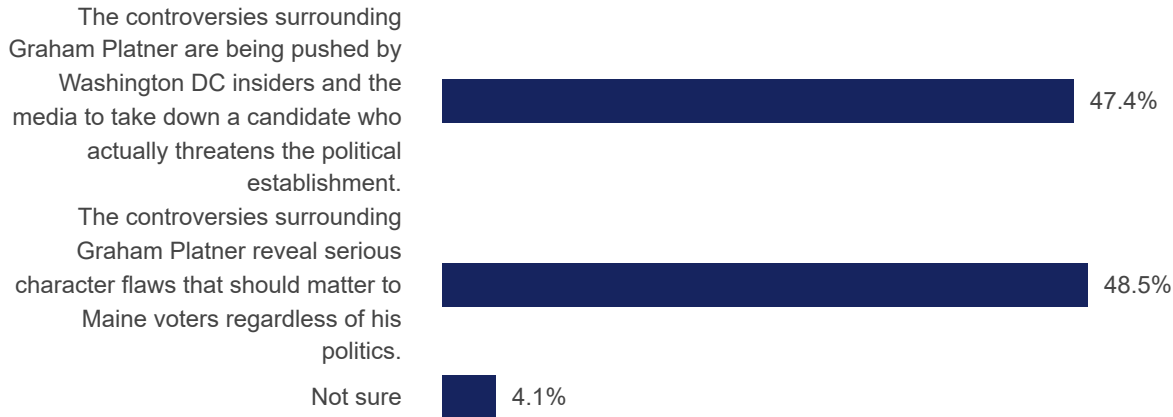

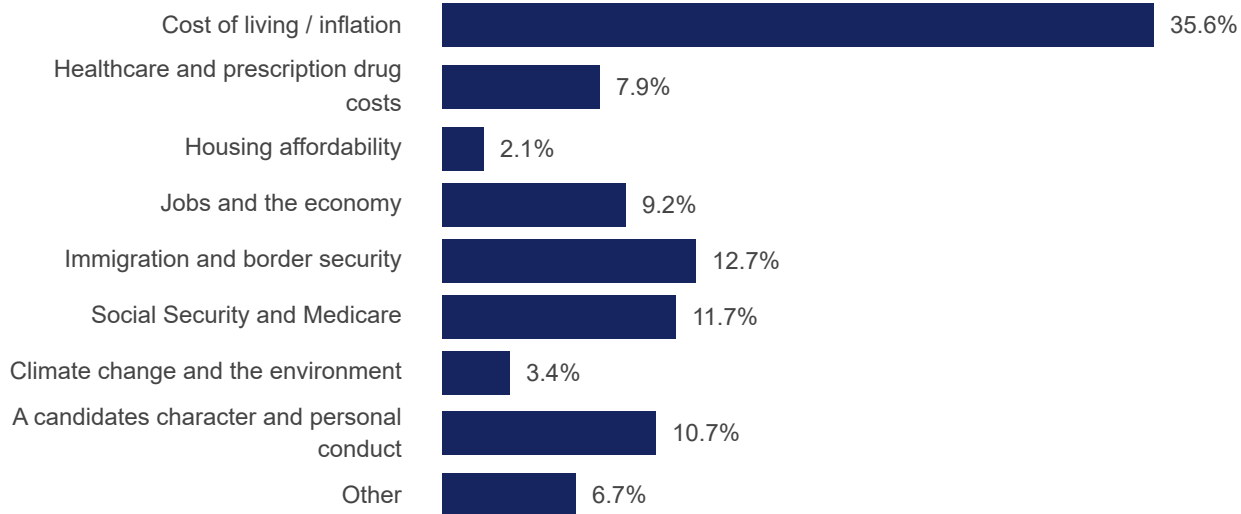
